## International Art

### Weci | Koninut • Canada Daily • First Ward Park

Created by Indigenous artists Julie-Christina Picher and Dave Jenniss, Weci | Koninut invites passerbys to a sensory journey through the forest (Notcimik) guided by the six seasons of the Atikamekw culture. The interactive installation offers an evocative space that encourages visitors to explore their own dreams and inner reflections.

### Los Trompos • Mexico Daily • Levine Avenue of the Arts

Los Trompos (Spinning Tops) by Mexican creators Esrawe + Cadena draws its inspiration from a toy that has been popular with children around the world since the dawn of time. This large-scale, interactive artistic installation engages visitors in a way that is both meaningful and playful.

## Local Art

### Easter Eggs on Parade

#### The Green

Eggs on Parade, a dozen of beautifully and uniquely designed larger-than-life Easter eggs created by 12 different local artists, using the theme, *Let Wonder Lead the Way*.



### !cons

#### Legacy Union Plaza

These giant exclamation points, each designed by a local artist, showcase bold creativity and unique interpretations of the Charlotte **SHOUT!** theme, *Let Wonder Lead the Way*.

### Fish by Doyle Bussey

#### The Green

An interactive sculpture made of recycled plastic drums and steel wire from old political signs. *Fish* blows bubbles during the day and provides a light show at night. *Fish* is meant to be fun, but also speak to the need for humanity to be responsible stewards of the natural environment.

### Tumbling Textures by Claire Kiester

#### Bank of America Corporate Plaza

This is a large-scale soft sculpture installation that features three large orbs composed of recycled plastic containers filled with various materials. As viewers spin them by hand, they are surrounded by a symphony of sounds, similar to that of a rain stick. *Tumbling Textures* sparks curiosity in viewers and challenges their preconceived notions about crochet and recycling.

### ShoutOke Frequency by Aguinaldo Santos

#### Levine Avenue of the Arts

*ShoutOke Frequency* is a giant, interactive radio sculpture that turns voices into light and sound. Blending shapes, materials, and sizes, it invites everyone to explore, play, and experiment. Solar-powered and hands-on, the installation celebrates curiosity, creativity, and shared moments of joy and discovery.

### Portal to Imagination by Jeff Cason

#### District One Alleyway, 101 S. Tryon Street

Open a portal to a world of infinite possibility! Press the green button to activate the magic portal and peek into another dimension. Where will it take you? The ocean depths? Above the clouds? Or somewhere otherworldly? There's only one way to find out.

### Welcome Voices by Tara Spil

#### First Ward Park

*Welcome Voices* is an interactive installation celebrating Charlotte's newcomers. With 157 people moving here daily, it highlights their stories and experiences. If you moved to Charlotte in the last one to two years, visit [welcome2clt.com](http://welcome2clt.com) to add your voice to this work.

### Symbolic Peace by Liquid PXL

#### Curiosity Courtyard

*Symbolic Peace* is a 10-foot-tall steel sculpture shaped as a peace sign. Each facade is laser-cut with a diverse collection of religious and non-religious symbols, reflecting the many paths toward unity and coexistence. By day, it stands as a bold, reflective form; by night, it transforms into a luminous beacon through an intricate internal LED lighting design.

*STARGATE* is an immersive projection sculpture designed to usher audiences on an awe-inspiring journey into the cosmos, with its hypnotic visuals and soundscape. Viewers are encouraged to climb into the central ring for a meditative experience and breathtaking photo.

### **Kaleid-Escape by Rebecca Lipps & Caleb Dickerson**

#### **First Ward Park**

*Kaleid-Escape* transforms the existing surface of this building into a controllable kaleidoscope. Choose a spot to watch the show or press a button to become the conductor of the visuals. Immerse yourself in soundscapes by local musicians and return throughout the 17-day festival for evolving surprises and new experiences.

### **The Oracles Speak by Dorne Pentecost**

#### **Curiosity Courtyard & ImaginOn**

Will White's **Wondrous Wardrobe** is a never-before-seen, immersive, fashion-led public installation for the third year of **SHOUT! Chic**, inspired by Alice in Wonderland and this year's theme, **Let Wonder Lead the Way**. Visitors move through a catwalk corridor with style-inspiration prompts, into the White Rabbit's "closet" for playful dress-up, onward to a Mad Hatter tea party scene, and finally into the Red Queen's Garden — making it one of the festival's most photo-worthy, interactive attractions that invites everyone to explore fashion, wardrobe, and wonder at their own pace.

"Shayla," her father pointed, "I think that might be an artist! Why don't we go say hello?"

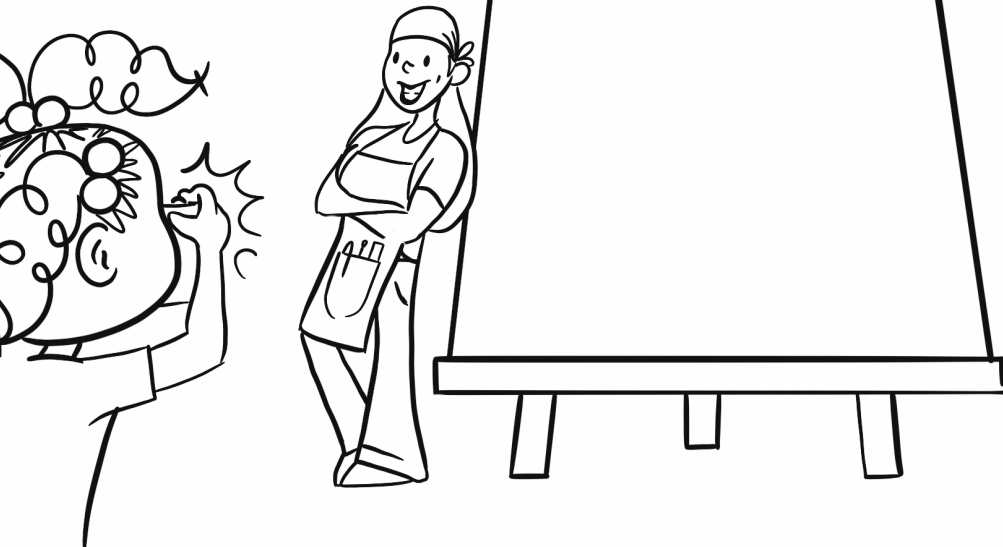

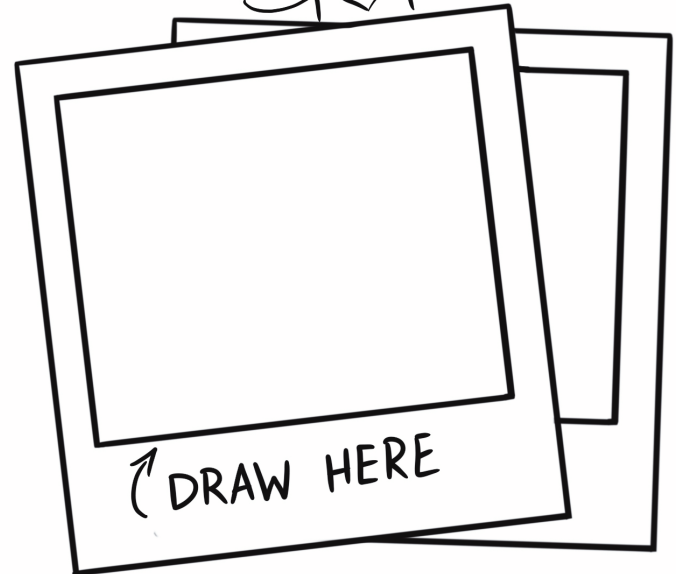

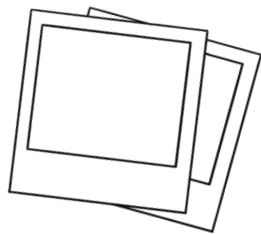
